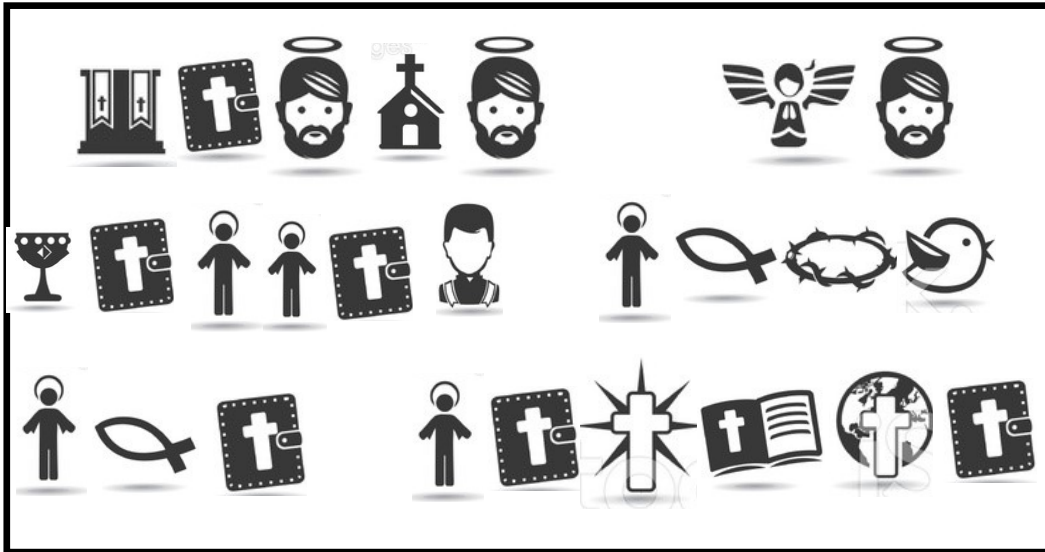
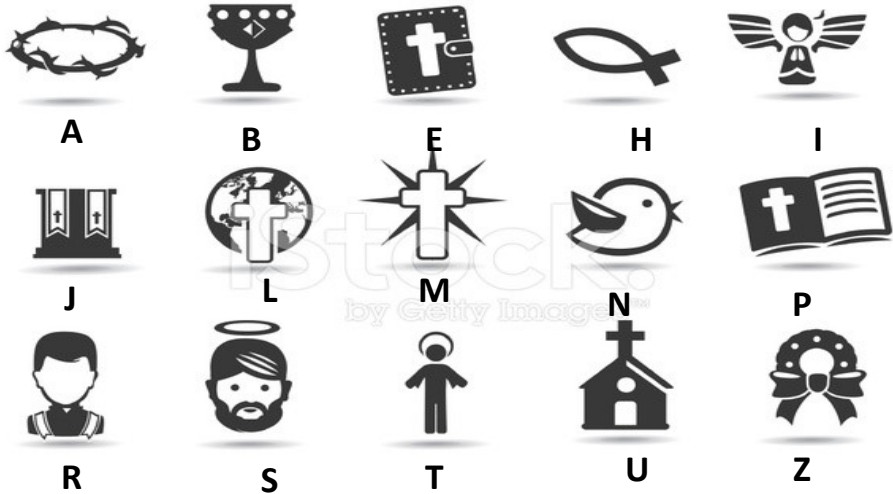


What did He Mean?

Follow-up Questions: Talk through these questions with your family after church.

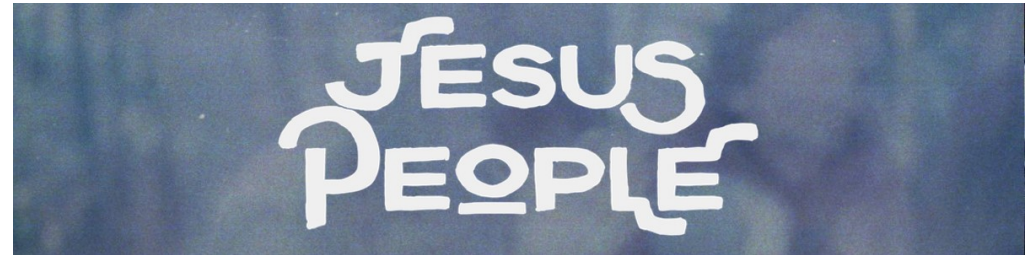
1. What type of things characterize a child of God?

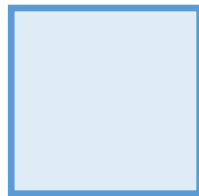

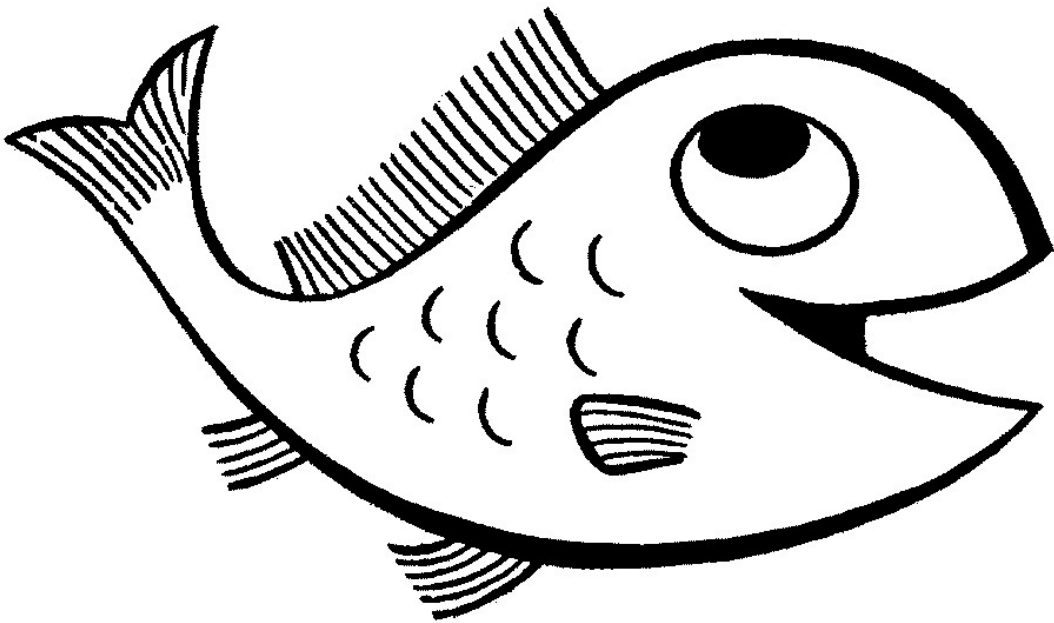

Definition Box

Today we are learning about a story of Jesus and tax collectors. In this story there are some words that we don't usually use. To help us understand our reading see the definitions below:

Capernaum: This was the area of Peter's home.

Two-drachma tax: This was a Jewish tax for Temple service taken once a year. This was not commanded by God, but was a tradition among the people. A drachma was about the price of two days of work.

Shekel: A silver coin worth about 4 drachmas.
